Primary Years Programme

Community

October is on its way out and cold mornings and shorter days are definitely on their way in. However, here at CAIS PYP our mornings are always warm and welcoming and our days and weeks seem to have a magical capacity to stretch endlessly to provide enough time for 1001 initiatives and projects the PYP community members have.

In the beginning of October we were joined by Mr. Rhys –our new EAL (English as an Additional Language PYP2-5) teacher and Ms. Monika – our PYP 3 homeroom teacher. Both of them have now settled and made very positive impressions on all their students and other members of CAIS staff.

Programme

Some of us have already begun or are about to start exploring new units.

K-1 Light is all around us and we use it in many ways.

PYP 1 Learning about previous generations helps us understand the connections between the past and the present

PYP 2 All living things go through a process of change.

PYP 3 Choices of the role models reflect the beliefs and values of individuals and societies.

PYP 4 Biodiversity relies on maintaining the interdependent balance of organisms within systems

PYP 5 Distribution of energy resources affects communities' and individuals' access to equal opportunities.

Others are well into their final assessment stage (Pre-k, K-2). Which means planning and collecting resources and provocations is underway and parent engagement, feedback and active support is very much appreciated.

The PYP team are currently spending their collaborative meetings (every Wednesday 15.00-16.15) discussing and reviewing our Language Policy, and our Assessment Policy to make sure that we describe and apply practices to truly benefit our students learning experience at CAIS.

We have also drafted and are working on our own Digital Literacy Policy, which would guide us in the safe use and successful integration of technology in the classroom (iPads, Smartboard, laptops, etc.)

All these new or updated versions of documents will be soon available on our website.

Professional Development

The upcoming weeks will be very busy for PYP staff in terms of professional development. As mentioned in the September's issue all of our PYP teachers will take part in an IB in-school workshop on Assessment in the PYP, which will take place November 9-10th, 2013. We will work on providing various strategies to observe, track, record and feedback children learning and progress as well as investigate ways in which children can self-assess themselves and use their reflections to motivate and guide their future learning. We will also describe successful tools used to provide:

- Assessment **as** learning
- Assessment **for** learning
- Assessment **of** learning

We are also beginning a series of 8 workshop sessions on iPad use and integration in the PYP classrooms. Twice a week all PYP staff will work on using iPad hardware and software in and outside the classrooms, to engage children in safe and informed use of technology for inquiry.

All of us also meet weekly in a 1-1 setting with the PYP Coordinator to reflect and plan the development of our units.

Projects

We are now working with DP and MYP students in **Reading Buddies** programme and are

looking for ways of working with parents towards inquiry in mother tongues of our students, possibly taking a step further from our last year's Big Readers' Project. More details on that will follow.

Ms. Krista (pre-k) and Ms. Aga (PYP Coord.) are actively promoting Scholastic book orders, which allow the parents to buy reading, phonics and inquiry content books that would normally be very hard to acquire in Changchun. We have already had one very successful order dispatched and are currently collecting the next one. Altogether we will run 4-5 order sessions a year.

Also Ms. Krista supporting the local "Caring Spirits" organization has encouraged our PYP 5 students to give back to the community by spending their Wednesday Club time working with children in a local kindergarten.

Friday 25th, "Caring Spirits" held a **bake sale** to raise money to help out the poor schools that we will be assisting this year. Thank you to all the parents, teachers and students who stopped by the table at lunch and picked up a yummy treat and you can eat it knowing that you helped make a difference in someone's life.

Events

International Day has yet again proven to be a very joyful, colorful and positive event leaving our children with a great sense of pride and joy of representing their individual cultural and national identity. Thank you for joining us on that day and celebrating together with the children.

On 25 October, through the initiative of Mr. Luis, Curriculum Leader for the sciences, our MYP5 students participated in a 20-minute radio broadcast that was aired around the world.

Entitled "Under the same smile", this annual event is organized by Gimnasio del Norte, an IB-world school in Bogota Colombia.

This year's theme is "Under the Same Smile" as a way to highlight that even though unfortunate events do happen every day, there are still a lot of good news which abound in different cities. The goal is not to deny our everyday reality but to look at it from another perspective. Our students shared good news and stories happening in Changchun.



November is assessment month

As an IB school, assessments play an important role in our programme. Assessments not

only help us gather information about what our students have learned, but they also serve to inform the next stage of teaching and learning.

On 11 – 13 November, MYP students will be taking their formal written assessments in Sciences, Language A, Language B, Humanities and Mathematics. These formal written assessments is just one of the tools that we use to collect data on student learning.

After the examinations, teachers will provide students some feedback and the time to reflect on their performance.

There are 47 MYP candidates for the Cambridge Preliminary English Examination (PET) and 21 for the First Certificate Examination (FCE). The oral communication test is scheduled on 22 November. The written examinations will be administered on 23 November for PET, and 26 November for FCE.

Please help your children get ready for these assessments by making sure that they get enough sleep and eat a healthy breakfast.

Being principled and caring

We are soliciting parents' support in enforcing the uniform policy by making sure that their children are wearing CAIS-issued top and pants/skirts. The Uniform Shop is now open from 8:30 – 9:30 to allow students to procure uniforms if needed.

It has been called to our attention that some students are using offensive language in their mother tongue. We can show that we are caring to others not just with our actions but with our choice of words as well.

Students are requested to prevent too much food wastage in the cafeteria by taking the amount of food that they can actually consume. It is alright to return for seconds or thirds if they are still hungry. We just want to avoid the situation where students pile up food in two or three plates, only to find out that they could not finish everything.

Home-school partnership

Finally, I would like to thank all parents who came to the Parent-Teacher Conferences on 12th October. Teachers agreed that it was a very fulfilling day as the information you had provided had given them the chance to get to know their students better, and you have also answered questions that they had about learning conditions and work habits at home. We hope to see you again for the second Parent-Teacher Conferences on 13th December.
